Blessed Stanley Rother

Father Stanley Rother is a priest of the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He also was doing mission work in Guatemala during the time of civil war. From 1971 to 1981, there were numerous killings of journalists, farmers, catechists and priests, all accused falsely of communism.

On July 28, 1981, armed men broke into his rectory, intending to abduct him. He resisted and struggled, but did not call for help, so others at the mission would not be endangered. He was shot twice and killed.

After the usual study of his case by the Congregation of Saints, it was recommended to Pope Francis that his death was a result of "hatred for the faith." Pope Francis approved a decree acknowledging Father Stanley Rother to be a martyr and his beatification. Cardinal Angelo Amato, Prefect of the Congregation of Saints, beatified him on Saturday, September 23, 2017 in Oklahoma City. Blessed Stanley Rother is the first U.S. born person to be declared a martyr. Those who are declared martyrs do not need a miracle to be beatified. To be declared a saint, a miracle must be attributed to his intercession. Blessed Stanley Rother pray for us!

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question: To solve the shortage of priests in this country, why can't we bring in priests from other countries where

they have enough?

Answer: This is a common question that makes one wonder where exactly is this country where there are so many priests? The place does not exist, but it raises some interesting issues, including people's attitudes towards priests. Firstly, diocesan priests are ordained for a diocese to serve the needs of their own people. Much of their ministry is based on knowledge of cultural norms, customs and values. They are called from their local communities to serve local needs. They are not all foreign missionaries. Secondly, Americans often assume wrongly that people of other nations are anxious to come to the US. Priests, like any of us, want to be close to family and friends and do not necessarily see us as having the land of wonder and opportunity. Thirdly, because of the shortage both priest and people have to adapt. In the short-term, things will be difficult. There may not always be a Mass in our parish every day or even every week. In the long run, the Holy Spirit will have to show us what we are to do. Fourth, ministry is everyone's responsibility, so get involved! Finally, show your appreciation and concern for the priests we do have. They have a tough job and it is not getting any easier.

Gospel for the Twenty - Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year A - Matthew 22:15-21

"Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." The Pharisees, full of malice, were trying to "entrap Jesus in speech." They concocted a question that flattered him, saying, "You teach the way of God in accordance with the truth," but which also put him in a position to be in big trouble if he challenged the Roman laws. Jesus, of course, escaped the trap with his brilliant reply. We can appreciate the wisdom of his response, but more importantly, we can appreciate what it means for us.

To repay to Caesar, in this case, meant to give appropriate allegiance to the secular authorities. We too are under such authority, and although Uncle Sam is different than Caesar in countless ways, the fact remains that as constituents of this country who enjoy its many benefits, we are also called to extend a certain kind of tribute to our government. Taxes, yes, but more than that too. The loyalty and patriotism that offers our gifts in service to the good of our nation is also

a tribute we Christians should make in good faith. Only when a law of our land contradicts the moral principles of God do we have to follow our *primary* allegiance instead, namely, our allegiance to Christ. Unfortunately, in our day we live under certain national laws that do conflict with the truth about human dignity, and thus a tension exists for us. But the course is clear. We must repay "to God what belongs to God" by defending the truth even when it may be unpopular. This kind of courage is what built the Church in those early centuries of persecution when practicing our faith was against the law. Heaven forbid this should ever happen to us. But if it does, we know what must be done.
