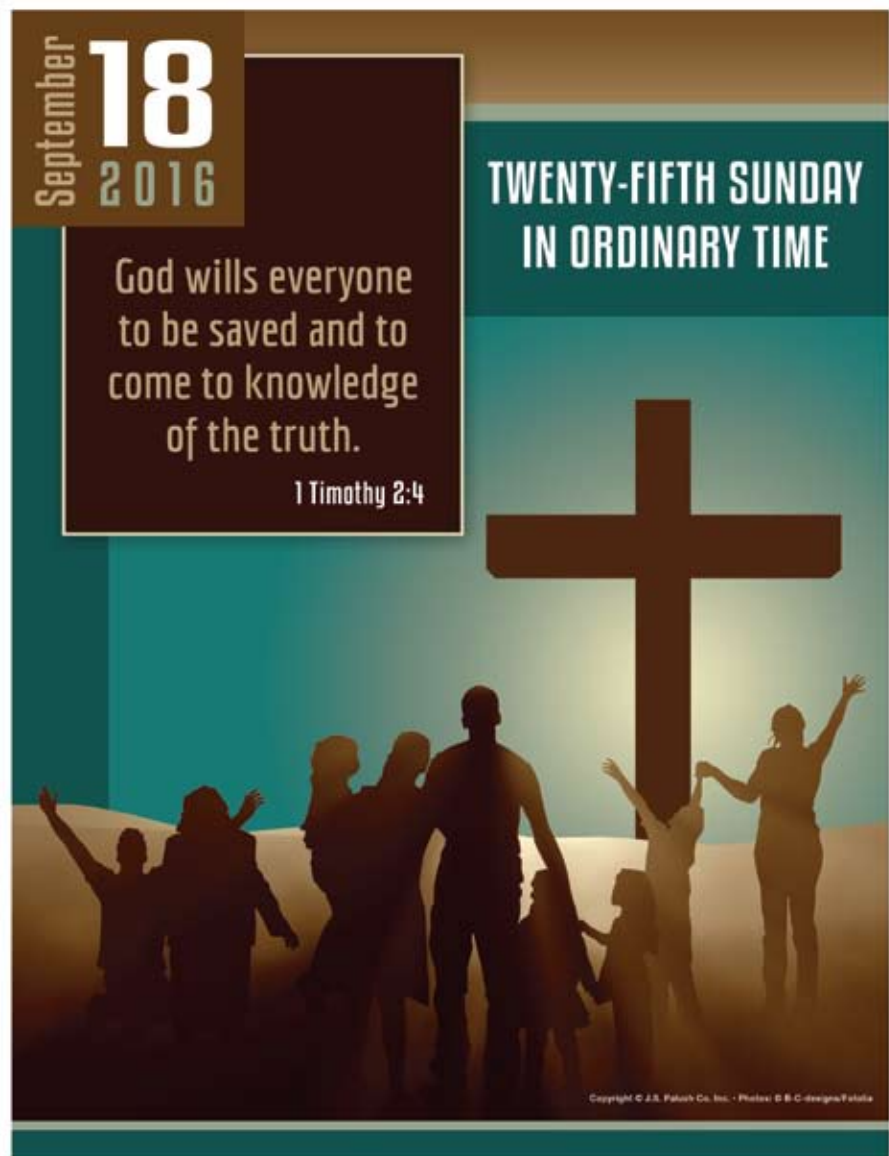

We have a social at Annunciation next Sunday, September 25, 2016 following the 9:00 a.m. mass. This is a “thank you” social for the Bazaar workers and for Deacon Chris Cambre [who will be returning to school in the middle of October].

We have a Church Family Picnic at St. Anthony on Sunday, October 9, 2016 following the 11:00 a.m. mass. After the Spring Picnic, it was requested we have two picnics a year. Also, at this picnic we will be able to express thanks to Deacon Chris Cambre as he will be returning to school on October 15, 2016.

Financial Statements for Fiscal Year July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016

The Operational Financial Statements for the Fiscal Year ending on June 30, 2016 for Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church, St. Anthony of Padua Church, and St. Edmund Catholic School are given this Sunday in each Church Bulletin.

For Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Church, the pie chart is in the Church Bulletin for Annunciation and is not in the bulletin for St. Anthony. The operating receipts are \$83,494.03. The operating disbursements are \$99,923.84. We had a deficit in operations of \$16,429.81. Because we did not have a Bazaar last fiscal year, our income is lessened. At the same time we completed updates on the shrine. We did need to replace one of the air conditions in the rectory. We also had to subsidize our faith formation activities. Our property and liability premium was \$6,998. I appreciate all parishioners at Annunciation for your support and care of our church.

For St. Anthony of Padua Church, the pie chart is in today’s bulletin for St. Anthony of Padua and is not in the bulletin for Annunciation. The operating receipts for St. Anthony are \$697,477. The operating disbursements are \$668,540. We had an interesting year in regard to lightning. In July lightning damaged our dimmer panel for the church, the church organ, some aspects of our bell system and our sound system. Our insurance claims for the fiscal year totaled \$50,67.51. This

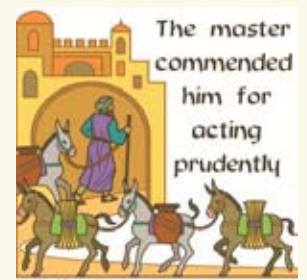
resulted in the diocesan risk management inviting us to put in lightning protection, where the insurance program paid half of the cost for the lightning protection. The insurance company also agreed to upgrade our church’s indirect ceiling lights to LED lights. LED lights use less electricity and do not give off heat as the other lights did. We also refurbished the cabinets in the old church sacristy. Going forward we see that the outside plazas at the church’s entrances need maintenance. Also the drainage on the east side of church needs attention as water collects on the sidewalk. The parking area for the church needs restriping. Repainting of some areas inside of church is needed; this is where there was water leaks and for work on sound, lights, and bell wires. I appreciate and thank all parishioners for your support and care for St. Anthony of Padua Church.

For St. Edmund Catholic School, the pie chart is in today’s bulletin for St. Anthony and is not in the bulletin for Annunciation. The operating receipts are \$2,563,637 and the operating disbursements are \$2,487,713. The balance of the loan for the new Gym as of July 31, 2016 is \$1,486,381.34. I appreciate and thank families who sacrifice to send their children to St. Edmund Catholic School and all others who support the school both parishioners and non-parishioners.

Gospel for the Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Cycle C – Luke 16-13

“And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently.” It is important to pay attention to the details of the parable Jesus tells in today’s Gospel. At first glance, it might seem as if Jesus is encouraging us to be dishonest. But in fact, it’s just the opposite. The steward in this tale was reported to his master “for squandering his property.” In other words, the steward was not being responsible with what he was in charge of. And the master was ready to fire him on account of it. But then, the steward had a change of heart. (This isn’t so hard to comprehend--sometimes it takes a real threat for us to realize we need to change our ways, doesn’t it?) So the steward went to the people from whom he had previously

collected money to "make friends" with them. How? By reducing their debts.

This might seem to be dishonest yet again, but we need to bear in mind that in the end, the master was pleased with the steward's behavior. So this debt reduction must not have affected the master's pocketbook. Rather, it seems probable that the steward had originally hiked up what the debtors owed the master and put the extra cash in his own pocket. This was the sort of extortion that was common in those days, among tax collectors for example. Now, when the steward was about to lose his position, he thought it wise to go back and return that "dishonest wealth" to the folks who had lost it, and gain some sympathy in the process. So, in the end, the steward was making up for his previous cheating behavior by doing something RIGHT and smart. It's this honest behavior that will enable him to take his place in "eternal dwellings." And surely our honest behavior will have the same effect.

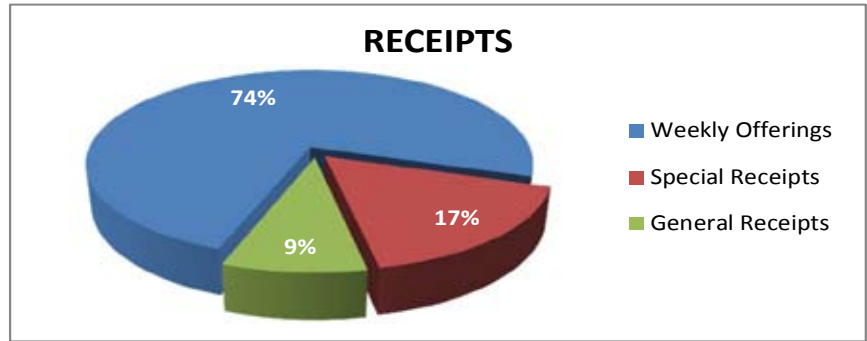

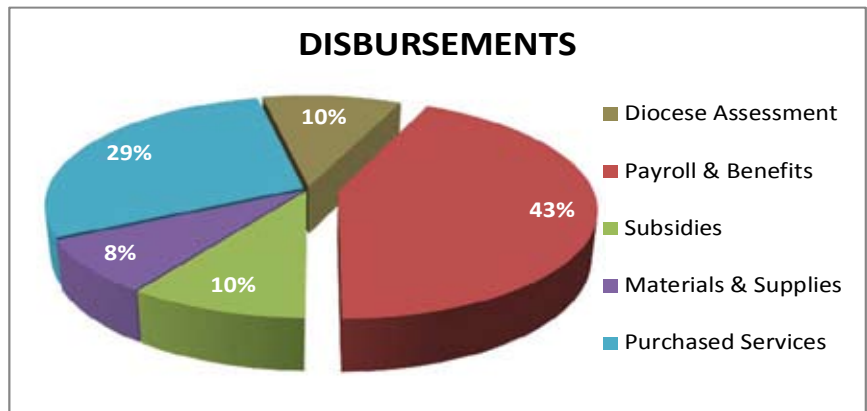

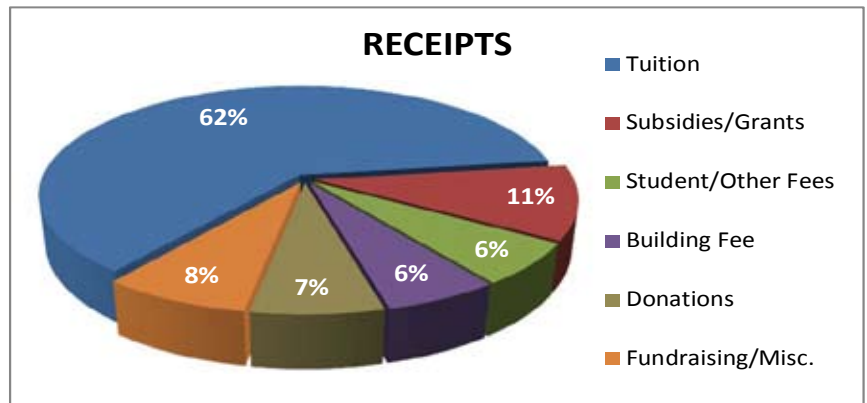

Fiscal Year July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016**

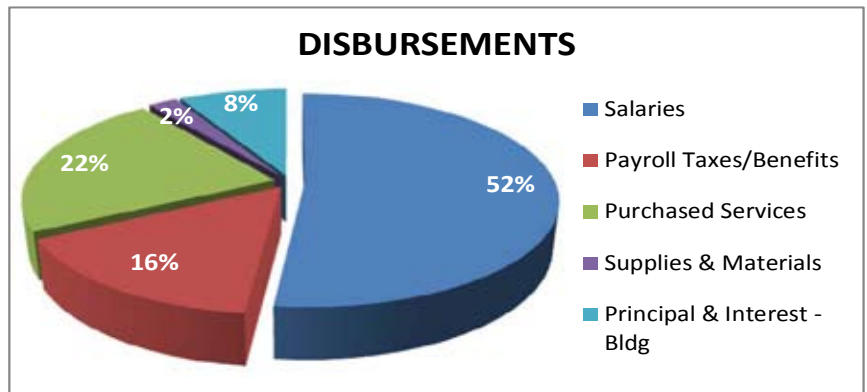
