DEAR PARISHIONERS OF ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA CHURCH & ANNUNCIATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY CHURCH,

Mary, Mother of the Church

In a decree dated February 11, 2018, Robert Cardinal Sarah, Prefect of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments, announced “Pope Francis has decreed that the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, should be inscribed in the Roman calendar on the Monday after Pentecost and be celebrated every year.” So beginning this year on Monday, May 21, 2018, the Monday after Pentecost, in the Latin-rite Church, the celebration of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church is celebrated as an obligatory memorial. This memorial celebration has precedence over any other memorial of a saint or blessed on the Monday following Pentecost.

Cardinal Sarah points out referring to John 19:25-27 the Church’s understanding Mary as Mother of the Church: “The Mother standing beneath the cross (cf. Jn 19:25) accepted her Son’s testament of love and welcomed all people in the person of the beloved disciple as sons and daughters to be reborn unto life eternal. She thus became the tender Mother of the Church which Christ begot on the cross handing on the Spirit.”

Activities at Annunciation and St. Anthony

At Annunciation: The first semester of the faith formation for grades 9, 10 and 11 is scheduled for June 9-14 and June 18-21, 2018.

At St. Anthony: (1) Because of the Clergy North Deanery Meeting on Tuesday, May 22, 2018, the mass will be at 6:15 a.m. and not at noon. (2) A Bake Sale will occur at the 4:00 p.m. mass on Saturday, May 26, 2018. This Bake Sale is sponsored by Family Missions for a parishioner to attend Faith Camp.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: How do we know when we receive the Holy Spirit?

Answer: Many of us discovered something as we got

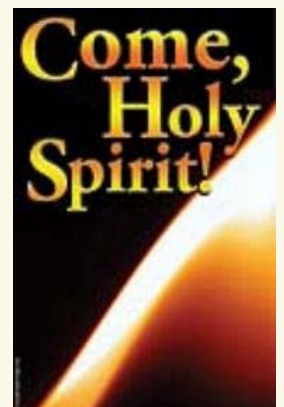
older. There’s a little bit of parents in us. Each time we catch ourselves using one of a parent gestures, expressions, or comments about a meal, we say, “I’m getting more like Dad!” “I’m getting more like Mom!” Many laughs and good-natured kidding may come out of it.

When we are confirmed, we receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit. There is no radical change in us that makes us seem suddenly different. Over a period of time, we come to see that there is a little bit of the Spirit in us. We catch ourselves using the gifts, and often end up wondering where a bit of wisdom came from, or why we were so patient or we feel intensity in our prayer. Perhaps we felt drawn to deepen our spiritual life or found courage in witnessing to our faith. That’s when we know we have received the Holy Spirit. We take on his image. Yes, we grow in age, grace, and wisdom, but we also grow in our awareness and understanding of the working of God in our life. We become more godlike, realizing we’re getting more and more like God. Our thoughts, words, and actions carry that quality and others, too, see it in us. You might call it holiness. But be confident! There’s a little bit of him in all of us.

Gospel of Pentecost Sunday, Year B – Option A, John 20:19-23

Today we celebrate the “birthday of the Church!” Pentecost is described in the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles. But before the great driving wind and tongues of fire empowering the Disciples, the Holy Spirit had already arrived. Option A, Gospel for today’s Mass during the day is from John 20. Jesus appears to the fearful disciples after his resurrection. [We heard this Gospel on the Second Sunday of Easter, Sunday of Divine Mercy.] He first speaks a message of calm. “*Peace be with you.*” The apostles “*rejoiced when they saw the Lord.*” When the enthusiastic response settles down, Jesus “breathed on them and said to them ‘*Receive the Holy Spirit.*’”

This action is Trinitarian, and it has happened before. If you turn your Bible back to the beginning, you’ll read: “*The Lord God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being*” (Genesis 2:7). In the Garden of Eden, we see God’s first, original covenant with man. The breath of life signifies that original indwelling of grace, the special state of likeness and friendship with God before the Fall. Here

now, in this locked room, the Apostles receive the long-awaited promise: the very breath of God, new life, a new covenant.

In the pairing of these two readings — the Pentecost experience in Acts and the breath of Jesus in John's Gospel — we see that the coming of the Holy Spirit is not only an empowering, it is an indwelling. We have each received the breath of grace in our baptism. It is confirmed, strengthened, and deepened in each reception of the sacraments. If we persevere in virtue, the Spirit of God is alive in us, inspiring our actions of love. This Pentecost Sunday, how is the breath of God alive in you?

Questions of the Week

First Reading – Acts 2:1-11 - We hear today about the descent of the Holy Spirit onto the Apostles and the birth of the Church. What do you think the miracle of Pentecost means for believers today?

Second Reading – Option B, Galatians 5:16-25 - Paul implores the Christians in the region of Galatia to “live by the Spirit.” Where do you see your faith community living by the Spirit?

Gospel Reading – Option B, John 15:26-27, 16:12-15 - Once again this Sunday we hear from Jesus' farewell discourse to the Disciples where Jesus foreshadows the coming of the Holy Spirit. Why do you think Jesus refers to the Holy Spirit as our “Advocate” and “the Spirit of truth”?
